Hands on Training

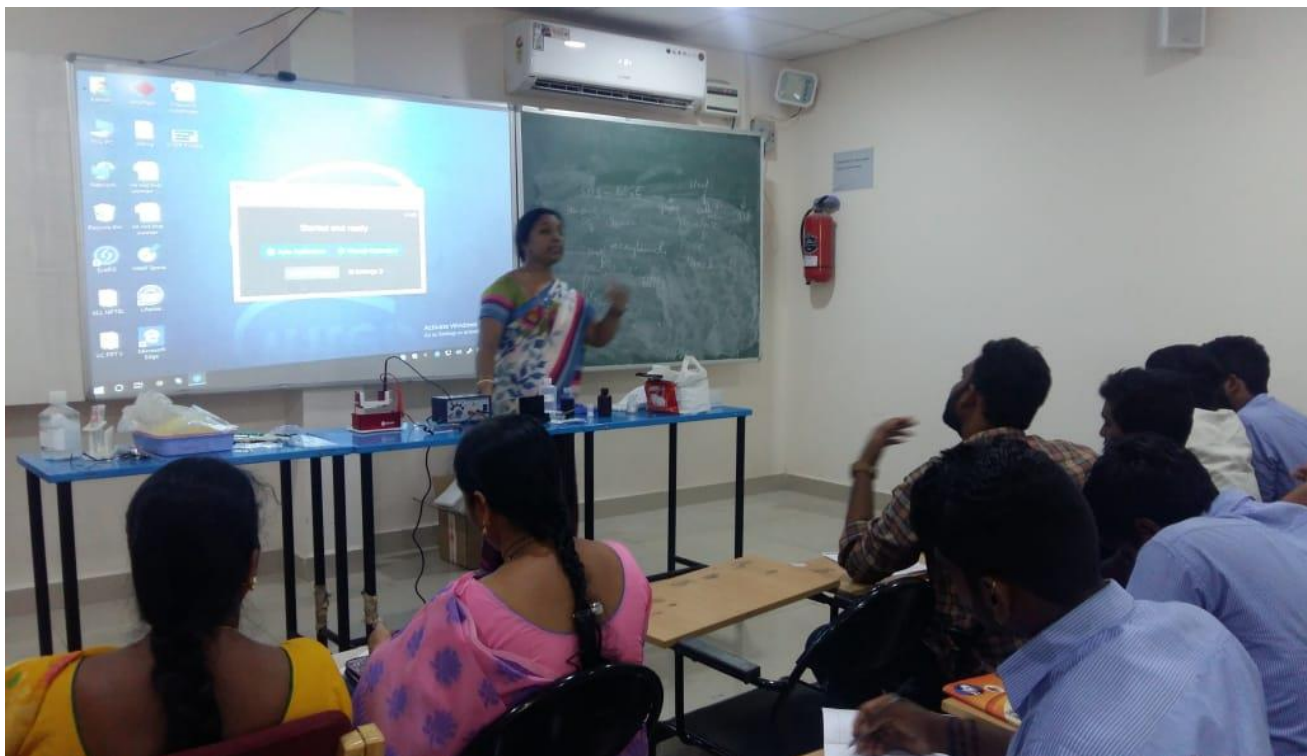
Activity: Guest lecture and hands on training by Mrs. Dorka Vijaya, Lecturer in Biochemistry, GDC Women, Guntur.

Laemmli SDS PAGE

[Abstract] Sodium dodecyl sulfate polyacrylamide gel electrophoresis (SDS-PAGE) is used to separate proteins with relative molecular mass no smaller than 10 KD. Very small proteins (<10 KD) are difficult to resolve due to low ability of binding to SDS, which can be solved by gradient gels or using different electrophoresis conditions, like Tricine-SDS-page. The basic Laemmli SDS PAGE procedure is described here.

Materials and Reagents

1. Pre-stain Protein MW marker (Bio-Rad Laboratories)
2. TEMED (Life Technologies, Gibco[®])
3. Ammonium persulfate (Sigma-Aldrich)
4. SDS (Research Organics INC)
5. 30% Acrylamide stock (37.5: 1 acrylamide: bisacrylamide) (Bio-Rad Laboratories)
6. Bromophenol Blue (Thermo Fisher Scientific)
7. Tris Base (Calsbiochem-Behring)
8. Glycine (EM Science)
9. EDTA (Amresco)
10. Glycerol (EM Science)
11. Isopropanol
12. Tris-HCl (pH 6.8)
13. β -mercaptoethanol (Sigma-Aldrich)
14. 10x running buffer (see Recipes)
15. 2x SDS protein sample buffer (see Recipes)

Equipment

1. Protein mini gel cassettes (Bio-Rad)
2. Heating block module
3. Table-top centrifuge
4. Power supply
5. Gloves

6. Filter paper

Procedure

A. Making SDS-PAGE gel

1. Clean and completely dry glass plates, combs, and spacers are required.
2. Assemble gel cassette by following manufacturer instructions.
3. Prepare 10% lower gel (separating gel) by adding the following solutions (wear gloves when prepare gel solution) (total volume= 5 ml)
 - 2 ml ddH₂O
 - 1.67 ml 30% acrylamide/Bis
 - 1.25 ml 1.5 M Tris (pH 8.8)
 - 25 μ l 20% SDS
 - 25 μ l 10% ammonium persulfate (make it fresh and store at 4 °C up to a month)
 - 2.5 μ l TEMED (add it right before pour the gel)

Note: Change ratio of ddH₂O to 30% acrylamide/Bis to get different percentage of separating gel.
4. To avoid polymerization, after adding TEMED, mix well and quickly transfer the gel solution by using 1 ml pipette to the casting chamber between the glass plates and fill up to about 0.7 cm below the bottom of comb when the comb is in place.
5. Add a small layer of isopropanol to the top of the gel prior to polymerization to straighten the level of the gel.
6. Once the gel has polymerized, start to prepare stacking gel (5%) by adding the following solutions (total volume= 3 ml)
 - 2.088 ml ddH₂O
 - 0.506 ml 30% acrylamide/Bis
 - 0.375 ml 1 M Tris (pH 6.8)
 - 15 μ l 20% (w/v) SDS
 - 15 μ l 10% ammonium persulfate
 - 1.5 μ l TEMED (add it right before the gel is poured)
7. Remove the isopropanol layer by using filter paper. Rinse the top layer of the gel with ddH₂O and dry off as much of the water as possible by using filter paper.
8. Add TEMED and mix the stacking gel solution well. Quickly transfer the gel solution by using a 1 ml pipette till the space is full, and then insert the appropriate comb.
9. Allow the top portion to solidify and then carefully remove the comb.

Note: The gels can be stored with the combs in place tightly wrapped in plastic wrap and put in a second container with wet tissue towel (keep the gels moist) at 4 °C for 1 to 2 weeks.

B. Sample preparation

1. Prepare same amount of protein samples according to BCA assay result, see BCA (bicinchoninic acid) protein assay.
2. Add the same volume of 2x protein sample buffer to each protein sample, mix and boil the samples at 95 °C heating block module for 10 min.
3. Spin the samples at the maximal speed for 1 min (samples from some tissue/cell sources may need longer spin) in tabletop centrifuge and leave the samples at room temperature until you are ready to load onto the gel.

Note: Can store extracted protein samples (containing sample buffer) at -20 °C and reheat at 95 °C for 5 min when used the following time.

C. Electrophoresis

1. Remove the gel cassette from the casting stand and place it in the electrode assembly with the short plate on the inside. Press down on the electrode assembly while clamping the frame to secure the electrode assembly and put the clamping frame into the electrophoresis tank.
2. Pour some 1x electrophoresis running buffer into the opening of the casting frame between the gel cassettes. Add enough buffer to fill the wells of the gel. Fill the region outside of the frame with 1x running buffer.
3. Slowly load the same amount of protein samples into each well as well as load 10 µl of protein MW marker.
4. Connect the electrophoresis tank to the power supply.

D. Protein detection

If protein of interest is about 0.2 µg or more in the sample, typically use Coomassie blue staining (see [Coomassie blue staining](#)). Otherwise, use silver staining (silver staining), which is more sensitive and can detect as little as 5 ng protein.

Recipes

1. 10x running buffer
30.3 g Tris-base
144.0 g glycine

10.0 g SDS

Completely dissolve in about 800 ml ddH₂O and then more ddH₂O up to 1 liter.

2. 2x SDS protein sample buffer

1.25 ml 1 M Tris-HCl (pH 6.8)

4.0 ml 10% (w/v) SDS

2.0 ml glycerol

0.5 ml 0.5 M EDTA

4 mg bromophenol blue

0.2 ml β-mercaptoethanol (14.3 M)

Bring the volume to 10 ml with ddH₂O.

Respected Principal and colleagues, today's workshop I have got an opportunity to explain CLUSTER pattern in Semester – VI.

7th paper of each of the domain specific subjects will be a domain related elective. More than one elective maybe offered giving choice to students. The electives maybe Domain specific applied or advanced i.e., specialization in nature. The number of electives maybe decided by the University concerned keeping the feasibility of conduct of university examinations in view.

Applied Elective: It is desirable that around 25% of syllabus is taught by field experts. The college has to make such an arrangement.

8th paper of each of the domain specific subjects (2nd paper of semester VI) will also be an elective. The electives maybe of inter-domain cluster, each cluster having three papers with or without project work or General in nature. The number of clusters maybe decided by the university concerned keeping the feasibility of conduct of University examination view. It is desirable that around 25% of syllabus is taught by field experts.

Cluster: In the last semester, for paper-8 each domain subject has one elective totaling three papers for each student. Electives maybe given as Clusters of three papers each for each subject. A subject can opt for all three papers of the same subject (Cluster stream) including or excluding project work for a wider learning experience. The student will not study the other two domain subjects for paper-8.

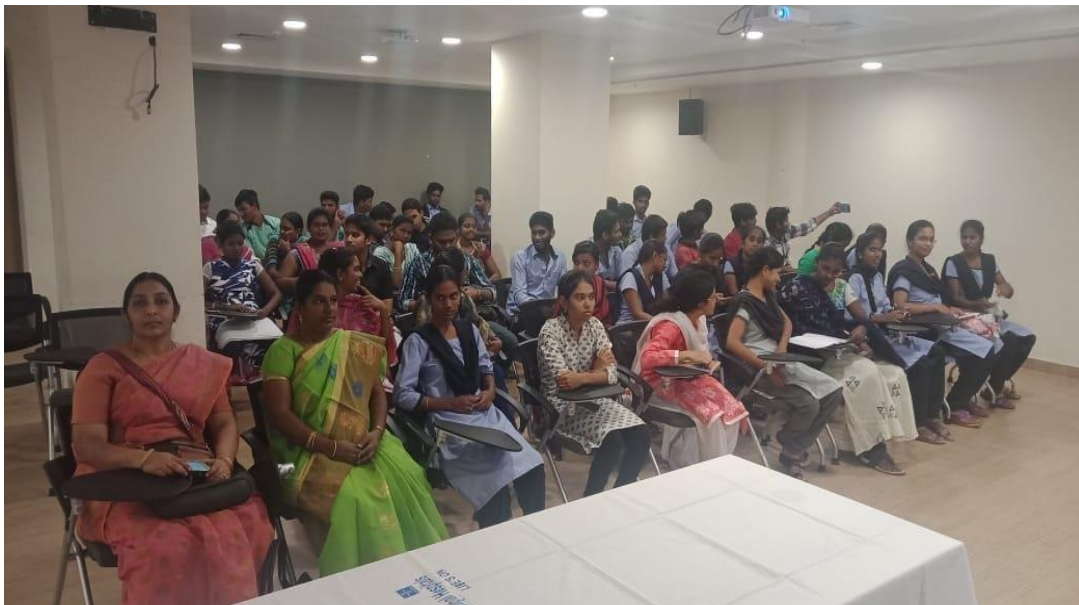

In the session, the students learned about CPR (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation). Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is a lifesaving technique useful in many emergencies, such as a heart attack or near drowning, in which someone's breathing or heartbeat has stopped. The American Heart Association recommends starting CPR with hard and fast chest compressions. This hands-only CPR recommendation applies to both untrained bystanders and first responders.

Students were trained to respond in case of a suspected heart attack, should Call 911 or your local emergency number, the patient is allowed to chew and swallow an aspirin while waiting for emergency help, patient can take nitroglycerine if prescribed, CPR should be started if the person is unconscious, If automated external defibrillator (AED) is immediately available. If the person is unconscious, follow the device instructions for using it.

They aware the students about how to treat significant burns until emergency help arrives. First to protect the burned person from further harm; make sure that the person burned is breathing; to remove jewelry, belts, and other restrictive items; covering the burn area, and not to immerse extensive, severe burns in water, to elevate the burned area, and observe for signs of shock.

For minor burns the first aid to be provided was explained. To cool the burn, remove rings or other tight items from the burned area, not to break blisters, to apply lotion, bandage the burn. If needed, take an over-the-counter pain reliever, such as ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin IB, others), naproxen sodium (Aleve), or acetaminophen (Tylenol, others).

During the session, students learned that, Recognizing the signs of a stroke can help someone lifesaving care on time; using an AED can potentially help a person's heart before emergency services will arrive

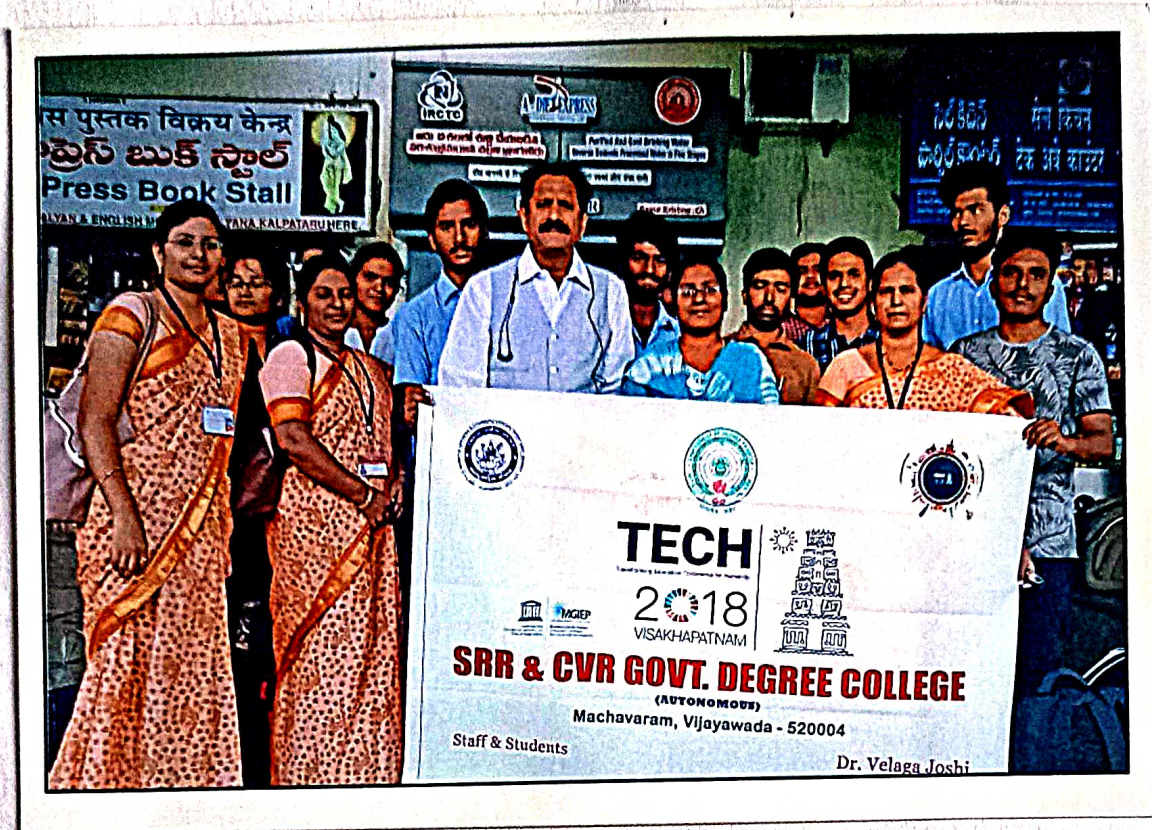

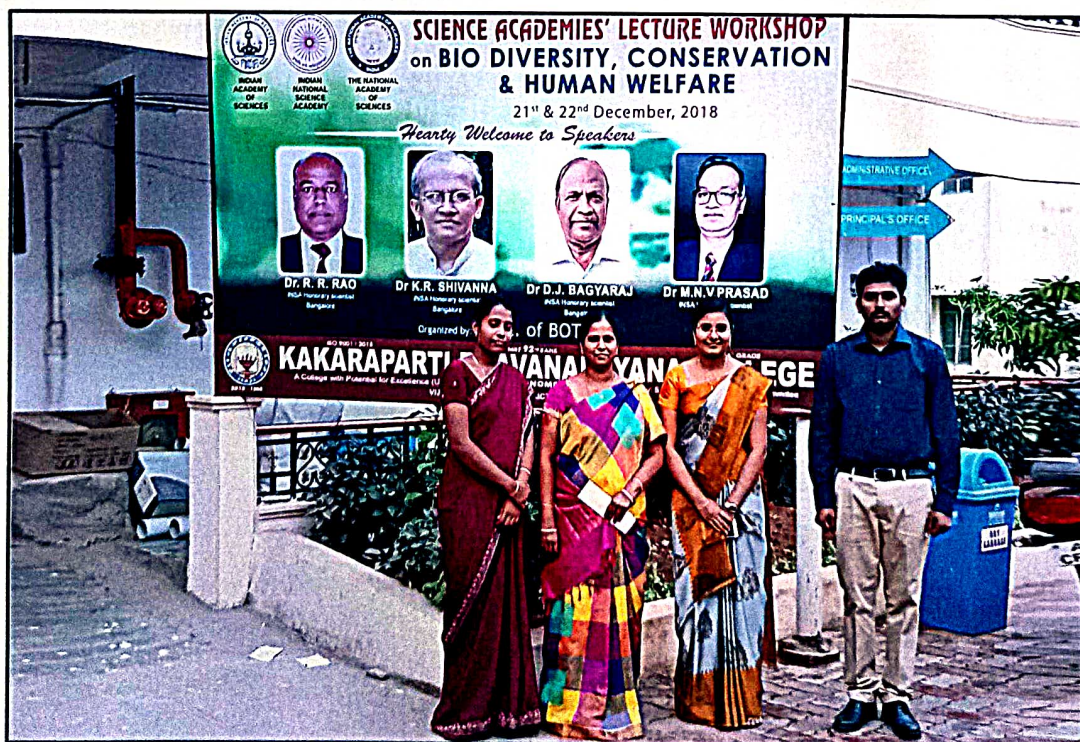

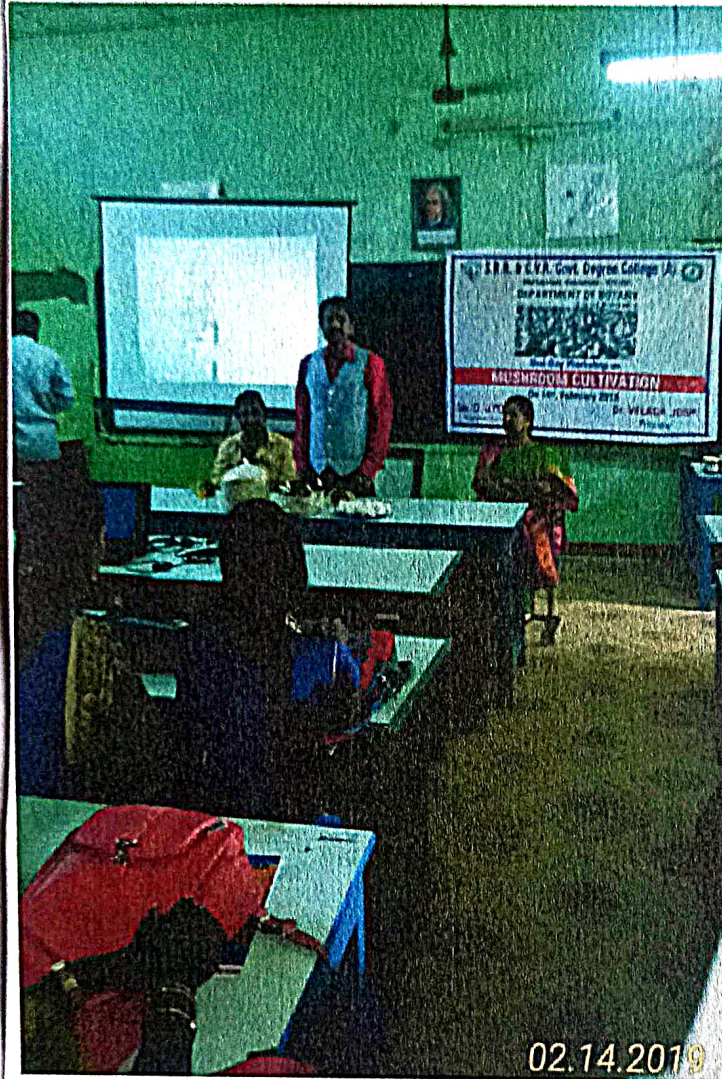

The AP Chief Information Officer Rtd. Sri Ramesh Kumar IAS and AP Information Officer Sri Srinivasu attended the workshop and addressed the RTI activists of 13 districts across Andhra Pradesh. Activists of 126 from 13 districts participated enthusiastically and expressed their own experiences. Dr.Illa Ravi, principal of the college spoke on the awareness and importance campaign on the Right to Information.



Dr.DSVS.Balasubrahmanyam, Associate Professor of the Political science department welcomed the dignitaries and spoke about the importance of the RTI Act with examples of his own experience. The Right to Information Act, simply known as RTI, is a revolutionary act that aims to promote transparency in government institutions in India. The Act came into existence in 2005, after sustained efforts of anti-corruption activists. RTI or Right to Information Act is a fundamental right and is an aspect of Article 19 (1)(a) of the Indian Constitution.

Right to Information replaced the Freedom of Information Act, 2002. Grounds for Rejection of RTI There are only three possible grounds on which information can be denied: The organisation is not a Public authority - eg. a Cooperative Society, or a Private corporate or Institution, not substantially financed or controlled by the Government.

Report:

The Department of Botany organized the Guest Lecture by Dr N. Krishna garu on the Role of Molecular Markers in Plant Breeding and Applications of Markers.

The Introduction of the Resource person is given by Dr .Ch. Srinivasa Reddy , Lecturer in Botany.

Principal Dr K.Bhagya Lakshmi garu gave the opening remarks and advised the students to develop research zeal by improving knowledge and practical skills . Madam explained the positive outcomes of such Guest Lectures and how the students can benefit from such Lectures

A Foldscope is an optical Microscope that can be assembled from a sheet of paper and a lens which is developed by Manuprkash with low cost . This is an example of cheap and easy tools available for scientific use in the developing world. Mycologists developed this .

The magnification power is enough to enable the spotting of organisms such as Leishmania donovani and Escherichia coli like Micro Organisms A Foldscope can be printed on a standard A4 sheet of paper and assembled in seven minutes.

Foldscope combines low-cost materials with precision optics to create inexpensive microscopes that are affordable for communities worldwide. With a magnification of 140X, Foldscope can visualize tiny things like bacteria and microorganisms as well as larger samples like insects, plants, fabrics, and tissues.

Foldscope is made of a lens, magnets, and paper. The lens is a glass ball that magnifies things. The magnets align and place the lens, and help devices attach to the Foldscope. The remaining of the Foldscope is a waterproof paper.

- 1. To insert a sample, flip your Foldscope to the yellow side and open the back flap.**
- 2. Hold your slide so that the sample is facing down, towards the lens.**
- 3. Hold the slide vertically in the middle of the Foldscope and insert each end of the slide into the top and bottom slots on the slide stage.**

So far, DBT has supported 409 schools and colleges (92 schools and 317 colleges) across the country by training the teachers / faculty to use Foldscope and provided micro grant (Rs. 4 lakhs to each selected school and Rs. 8 lakhs to each selected colleges) to pursue their research activities using Foldscope. The use of Foldscope among young students has encouraged them towards science exploration and strengthening their scientific temperament. The school and colleges used foldscope for training students to visualize unicellular and multicellular cells like bacteria, fungus, protozoans, plant cells, animal cells, arthropods and exopolymeric substances.

It aims to make reasonable and easy tools available for scientific use in the developing world. It is a portable, robust and versatile microscope made mostly out of paper (water-proof) that can magnify from 140x and has 1.9 μm resolution without the bulkiness and expense of a conventional research microscope.

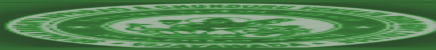
