2. The Chairman has to prepare the list of Examiners and Paper Setters and will be submitted to the Academic Council.
3. The committee has approved the syllabus with **5 Units for 6 Papers in Semesters I & 7 Papers in Semester II** respectively.
4. The committee has approved the Model Question Papers for external exams - 60 marks and is divided as follows,
 - a. In Section A, answer **any 5** out of 10 Questions. Each one **carries 4 marks**, totaling to **20 marks**. From each Unit/Module 2 questions have to be selected.
 - b. In Section B, answer **all 5** questions. Each question has internal choice. Each question **carries 8 marks** totaling to **40 marks**. Each question has to be selected from each unit/Module.
 - c. Time Duration – 3 Hours.
5. The committee has resolved and approved to conduct the external examinations either in offline, online or blended in view of Pandemic Covid-19 situation.
6. The committee has approved the Blue Print of the question paper. Question paper has to be designed in such a way that **24 marks have to be obtained from each unit/Module.**
